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A group of highly experienced Islamic scholars have designed the curriculum to suit the schedules of even the busiest students. Imagine studying the Alim course in the traditional way right from your home under highly experienced and educated Islamic scholars. Imagine joining them through live video-conferencing and being among those who followed the command of the Prophet Muhammad (Peace be Upon Him); one who is present must convey (the knowledge) to one who is absent. Using English, then Arabic medium, our six-year Islamic studies course is designed and developed to cater specifically to English speaking students.

Our audience is for brothers and sisters, who intend to study the Islamic sciences but are prevented by their jobs or family responsibilities. This course is also beneficial for university and college students who desire to serve Islam, but their ongoing education does not allow them to enroll in a full-time Islamic institute. It also targets those who cannot afford to travel to study abroad. We provide them a chance to study and help them to become an Alim / Alimah to serve mankind.

Darul Uloom Online offers four courses. The detail of each course is given with the course duration and desired eligibility. Every academic year consists of the Fall and Spring semester. In general, Fall Semester starts in the month of July and ends in the month of December. Similarly, the Spring Semester starts in the month of January and ends in the month of June.

At the end of each semester, examinations are conducted upon applicable subjects and 10 days special preparation leaves are granted to students for better preparation of their examinations. The management, education administrator and teachers always remain in an active contact with students. We have break for the holy month of Ramadan, however, the Islamic preaching remains active for active participation of the students.

## Bachelor in Islamic Studies

### Alim/Alimah Program (Preparatory)

*Duration: 04 Years | Credit Hours: 140*

*Brothers & Sisters both are welcome to attend this program.*

Eligibility: Students must be able to read Al-Quran in Arabic, however, the Arabic understanding is not a desired eligibility.

Teaching Hours: Full time students are expected to attend classes 3 hours per day for five days of a week which is approximately equal to 12-15 hours per week.

## Master in Islamic Studies

### Dawah-Fazeelah Program

*Duration: 02 Year | Credit Hours: 90*

Eligibility: Students must have completed Bachelor in Islamic Studies /Alim / Alimah Program (Preparatory) of 4 years from DUO or equivalent course from any other institution based on **'School of Hanafi Thoughts'**.

This is a full-time program having a duration of 1 year. Those students who have completed five years of Alim / Alimah Program from DUO or equivalent course from any other similar institution are eligible to pursue this program. The requirements for sixth year ensure that our students maintain and retain the highest caliber of Islamic knowledge and morals. It is expected that our students will carry their knowledge to benefit the present and future generations. Therefore, we have set the following admission criteria;

- Maintain a minimum average of 85 in each & every subject.
- Provide referrals of at least two certified scholars. One referral can be from a teacher at DUO, and one must be from outside the institute.
- Submit a minimum 800 words essay describing what you have gained and your future goals. What do you hope to accomplish as an Islamic scholar?
- Students must also demonstrate the sunnah of the Prophet Muhammad (Peace be Upon Him) in their daily lives.
- Assessment Examination.

After qualifying the prerequisites, students will be interviewed by the DUO. The interview result will be final and will be considered for admission.

## Flexible Learning Environment


